Violence Prevention Training - 5th June, 2023

KBRH Violence Prevention Training (Pilot), was held at the Josie on the 5th June, 2023. Led by Rob Mitchell IH and Dr Sue Benzer KBRH and facilitated by KBRH Helen Clugston, 16 KBRH physicians attended. The training provided medical staff in high risk areas with the knowledge, strategies and skills to support the prevention and deescalation of potential violent situations in the workplace. The training is delivered in a 3-part sequence; elearning 1.5hr online component, live 2 hour training and a site session post June 5th, 2023.

2 hour x sessionals were provided + UBC CPD credits.

This program was co-developed between Kootenay Boundary Physicians Association and Safety, Wellbeing, Innovation, Training & Collaboration in Healthcare (SWITCH BC) and was planned to achieve scientific integrity, objectivity, and balance. In-House Matters

Doctors of BC advocates for emergency department doctors and their patients

Advocacy is a big part of the work Doctors of BC does. We have been supporting the Section of Emergency Medicine in its efforts to address the major challenges our emergency departments are facing as physicians struggle to provide safe, quality care.

In May, Doctors of BC supported the Section with a media strategy and <u>news release</u> to take these serious issues to the public, resulting in major media coverage. We will continue to support this work and will keep our members updated on developments.

KBRH and Medical Staff Recruitment and Retention Dinner Guidelines

In order to manage our budgets dedicated to recruitment and new recruit welcoming dinners, KBPA is asking that

Ski for Free in KB Campaign

One of the primary KB Doctors marketing strategies is our Ski for Free in KB campaign, aimed at attracting physicians to our region. The campaign involves providing ski passes that facilitate physician recruitment visits, new recruits, locums, residents, and medical students. Additionally, when not utilized for recruitment, these passes are made available for retention purposes among KB region's med staff.

Discussions are underway for 2023/24 partnerships with Red Resort, Whitewater, Black Jack Ski Club and Nelson Nordic for the KB Region to support efforts to recruit physicians to our region.
