Message from our President: Dr. Kathryn Hale

Dear Physicians,

While it is still technically fall, many of us are excited to see the snow falling and are preparing for the ski season ahead! As we move into winter, we will be celebrating our Christmas gathering at the MSA quarterly meeting on Monday, Dec. 4.

For the staff recognition awards we want to do a new process for the event. Each department will be allocated a number of awards based on the number of physicians in the department to ensure equitable distribution of the 10 recognition awards. Working with IHA operations director Andrea Dutchak, we have been able to continue discussions about space utilization, parking, and are opening discussions about the planned EHR implementations. We can access one time funding to support physicians during the transition to the EHR so please connect with us if your department is interested.

I'm pleased to welcome our two new board members Drs. Caroline Gardiner and Elena Shurshilova. Both are keenly interested in supporting improvements in our hospital and participating in guiding our work. The board also sends its thanks to our outgoing board members Drs. Ian Sibbald and Sue Babensee who have served many terms leading the work of the KBPA and ensuring our physician voice has been engaged in critical conversations.


